Henry Cole is the celebrated illustrator of over 50 books for children, including the Bad Boys series by Margie Palatini, award winning *Wee Piggy* by Kim Norman, and numerous books by Pamela Duncan Edwards. He is also the author and illustrator of titles such as *Unspoken*, *On Meadowview Street*, and

Middle School and High School Teachers, Reading Specialists **Nikki Giovanni**, is a poet, activist, mother, and professor. Early in her career she was dubbed the "Princess of Black Poetry," and over the course of more than three decades of publishing and lecturing she has come to be called both a "National Treasure" and, most recently, one of Oprah Winfrey's twenty-five

"Living Legends." She is a seven-time NAACP Image Award winner, and the first recipient of the Rosa Parks Woman of Courage Award, and holds the Langston Hughes Medal for Outstanding Poetry, among many other honors. The author of some thirty books for adults and children, and a Grammy nominee for *The Nikki Giovanni Poetry Collection*, she is the University Distinguished Professor of English at Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Virginia.

Anna Dewdney is the bestselling author and illustrator of over 15 award-winning children's books, most notably the *Llama Llama* series. Her stories have been adapted into several theatre productions and have been translated into more

than ten foreign languages. Anna grew up outside New York City and has lived in Vermont since the early 1980s. Before writing and illustrating her own work, she illustrated several books for other writers. Anna is a strong advocate of literacy and in addition to speaking across the country on the importance of reading for children, she has published articles about this topic in several publications including the *Wall Street Journal*. Anna supports environmental efforts, including pangolin conservation in southeast Asia, as well as local historic preservation. Anna enjoys running and gardening. She is the mother of two daughters and several dogs.

Roland Smith is an author of young adult fiction as well as nonfiction books for children. Smith graduated from Portland State University and, following a part-time job at the Oregon Zoo in Portland, began a 20-year career as a zookeeper.

After working to save wildlife following the Exxon Valdez oil spill, he published his first book, *Sea Otter Rescue*, a nonfiction account of the process of animal rescue. Over the years, Roland has written numerous books for adolescent readers, including *Jack's Run, Zach's Lie, Cryptid Hunters, Peak, Tentacles, Chupacabra, Elephant Run,* and the *Storm Runners* series. He is also the co-author of *S is for Smithsonian, N is for Our Nation's Capital*, and many other picture books with his wife Marie. The Smiths live on a farm in Oregon.
